

### Synopsis

Mortimer Brewster is living a happy life: he has a steady job at a prominent New York newspaper, he's just become engaged, and he gets to visit his sweet spinster aunts to announce the engagement. Mortimer always knew that his family had a bit of a mad gene -- his brother believes himself to be Teddy Roosevelt -- but his world is turned upside down when he realizes that his dear aunts have been poisoning lonely old men for years! When Mortimer's maniacal brother, Jonathan (who strangely now resembles Boris Karloff), returns on the night that the aunts were planning to bury the newest victim, Mortimer must rally to help his aunts and protect his fiance -- all while trying to keep his own sanity. An uproarious farce on plays involving murder, Arsenic and Old Lace has become a favorite amongst regional theatres throughout America.

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**Joseph Otto Kesselring** (July 21, 1902 – November 5, 1967) was an American playwright known best for Arsenic and Old Lace, a hit on Broadway from 1939 to 1944 and other countries as well. He was born in New York City to Henry and Frances Kesselring. His father's parents were immigrants from Germany. His mother was an English Canadian. Kesselring spent much of his life in and around the theater.

In 1922 he began teaching vocal music and directed stage productions at Bethel College in North Newton, Kansas a Mennonite school. After two years, Kesselring left teaching and returned to the stage, working for two years with an amateur theatrical group in Niagara, New York. He began working as a freelance playwright in 1933, completing 12 original plays, of which four were produced on Broadway: There's Wisdom in Women (1935), Arsenic and Old Lace (1939), Four Twelves are 48 (1951), and Mother of that Wisdom (1963). Arsenic and Old Lace was his masterpiece. It ran for 1,444 performances on Broadway and 1,337 performances in London, and became a staple on the high school and dinner theater circuits. The movie version released in 1944 was also a comedy hit.

### 1941 Pop Culture References (We Googled it so you don't have to!)

**Winchell** - Walter Winchell, (in)famous entertainment reporter, critic, and columnist from early-mid 20th century

**Pirandello** - Luigi Piranello, an Italian playwright known for his absurdist writings and tragedies. His most well-known work is "Six Characters in Search of An Author."

**Strindberg** - Johan August Strindberg, widely considered the "father" of modern Swedish literature, as well as modern theater. Most of his major works were written in 1870s.

**Burns Mantle** - famed theater critic. In 1920, he established the yearly "Best Plays" book series.

"Hellzapoppin" - a slapstick musical comedy review, which premiered on Broadway in 1938. Among other things, the show included a lampoon of Adolph Hitler and a minstrel act featuring Benito Mussolini.

Judith Anderson - one of the premiere dramatic actresses of the mid-20th century, she famously portrayed the creepy (and all black-clad) housekeeper Mrs. Danvers in the 1940 film "Rebecca."
