

(Choreographer) Lisa is very excited to be back! She works at Memorial Hospital,


Starbucks, and teaches for the Hoogland Education Program. She is going to school to become a physical therapy assistant. Lisa sends love to her family, Hannah and her friends.

From that time on — through performances in many Springfield venues before the construction of our building at 101 E. Lawrence, to our name change to Springfield Theatre Centre and our new location at the Hoogland Center for the Arts — our goal has been the same. We bring our community and the arts together.

We strive to provide Central Illinois with quality theatre, educational opportunities, and a creative outlet for live theatrical arts. Our Junior shows, PAVE arts camp, and our affiliation with the Active & Creative Teen Theatre offer young people an opportunity to learn the skills necessary to build confidence not only in performance, but in all aspects of theatre.

We welcome your participation in our 74th season. Whether you are a volunteer, cast or staff member, or a member of our audience, we sincerely appreciate your support!

Performances were in various Springfield locations before the building at 101 E. Lawrence was built, including the Hotel Abraham Lincoln, Illinois Building Auditorium, Knights of Columbus Auditorium, Hay-Edwards School and the Playhouse at 15th & Laurel.
